Messing About in Boats

Mayday! Mayday! Do you know how to deal with this either when you hear it on the radio, or when you need to make the call? This thought occurred to me when I was out sailing recently. All boaters out there should have an operator's card and if they have a VHF radio then they should also have taken an operators course and know how to make calls for help. In the real world I wonder if that is the case. When I am on the Lake my VHF radio is always on, but I have never yet heard a "Mayday" call. I suspect that most of the boaters out there don't know the procedure even if they did have an emergency. I suspect that in this day and age if there was a problem most would reach for their cell phone and call 911, which may be more realistic to reach police or ambulance, but the advantage of a Mayday call is that other boaters in

the vicinity will hear it and be able to reach the caller with assistance a lot quicker than the shore bound agencies.

As we all know the world of communication is changing very rapidly. Mayday, which is a corruption of the French term for "Help me" was developed by mariners many years ago. Even before radio it was sent by light or flag signals to any ship within sight. The VHF radio procedure was a natural progression, but now with universal wireless communication in everyone's possession the procedure seems to have broken down, especially for recreational use in coastal or lake waters.

Due to the popularity of boating and the availability of boats within everyone's price range, or credit range, boating has become so universal that it is no longer an activity to which one dedicates a life interest or thinks of as a dedicated pastime, to be studied and developed over a period of years. As a consequence, procedures that were so important to the dedicated boaters of years ago have

largely been ignored or forgotten. The rules that governed boating in general are largely ignored or forgotten by the casual recreation boater, as there is little or no enforcement of the regulations. The resources dedicated to patrolling the Okanagan Lake, or any other lake, are minimal at best and this probably reflects the importance that our society places upon boating safety in general.

The radio and television have been giving almost daily accounts of drownings usually caused by carelessness or lack of knowledge of the hazards of enjoying the cooling, refreshing, qualities so desirable on a hot summer day. Boating is generally considered a "fun" activity, but playing in or on the water also requires knowledge and responsibility.

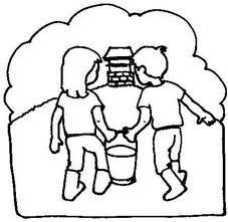

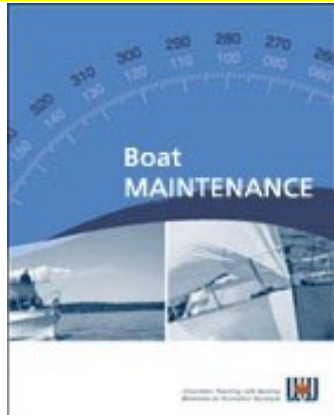

Marine Boat & Engine Maintenance The enjoyment of the boat includes the satisfaction of properly maintaining it. To many boaters, working on their boat is part of the fun, to say nothing of the savings in costs. All boats require maintenance to correct the gradual wear and tear, and exposure to the elements. A boater should be on the alert for signs of potential problems, and make repairs while the problems are minor. From spark plugs to bottom paint, the Marine Boat & Engine Maintenance Course covers all the basics for the DIY boater.

This course has been completely re-written. The course is divided into two parts, as follows:

Part 1

- Marine engines - gasoline and diesel, inboard and outboard
- Steering systems
- Emergency repairs afloat

Part 2

- The Hull - wood, fiberglass, aluminum and steel
- Painting and repairs to the hull
- Care and feeding of thru-hull fittings
- Marine electrical
- Marine plumbing
- Seasonal maintenance



We will offer the course in the Fall of 2012, commencing Tuesday, September 4 at 7:00 pm.

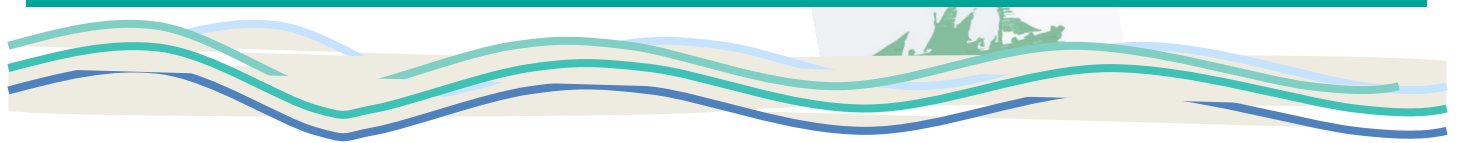
