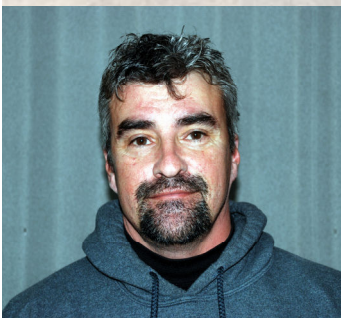

Now that the holidays are behind us and there is still far too much winter ahead of us before the 2015 boating season the winter will nonetheless, upon reflection, pass quickly and then we'll realize just how little time we really had to accomplish all that we hope too this year. So press on we shall!

Installation of the 8 new concrete fingers planned for C dock has been delayed once again by the Contractor due to the heavy volume of work they presently have before them. The last time I spoke with the Contractor he advised he was hoping to be installing them by the middle of the week of December 15th, which is the very time I prepared this report but yet no sign of the new fingers arrival.

The fingers are poured and ready to be delivered from the Contractors yard in Kelowna and though we really don't need to have them actually in-place before the end of March, it would sure be nice to see them go in sooner rather than later.

Speaking of progress I am pleased to report some headway has been made on planning of the addition to the Clubhouse to allow us to increase the size of our kitchen. Through discussions with Jay Langton and Corrine Kirton Associate Member Cathryn Anderson prepared a layout of the proposed space, which now allows us to move onto having construction drawings prepared.

Concurrent with that step we will be finalizing the minimum code upgrades to the building that must be done before the addition can proceed, cost out those upgrades and then, with any luck, we will be applying for our building permit before the end of January.

If you haven't already seen it, Member John Halper completed construction and installation of the new wheelchair ramp in the lower level and has done an incredibly professional job, many thanks to John and his talents. This new ramp is longer than what we had previously, which lowers the incline that our Members and guests with mobility challenges must negotiate when they access the lower level washrooms from the parking lot.

While still moving forward on plans for the replacement of the breakwater system things are not moving forward as quickly as I would prefer. I expect the month of January to allow me more time to spend on this project and will continue to report to you the progress as it is made.

Be sure to renew and pay your membership before the end of January to avoid any penalties and then make an effort to come out and spend your Yacht Bucks to enjoy the amenities our Clubhouse has to offer and the warm, welcoming and friendly experience our incredible staff provide while you are there. Friday night steak or salmon dinners and Sunday brunch continue right through the winter and make sure to constantly check the calendar you'll find elsewhere in the Tiller for upcoming special events such as Ladies Night.

On behalf of Rebecca and myself I would like to finish this report wishing all of you health, happiness and success in the New Year!

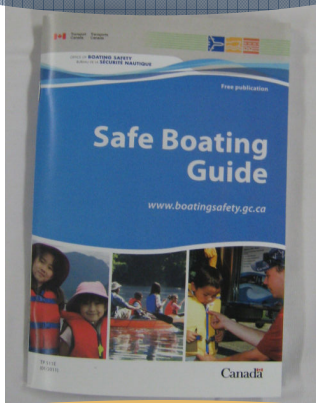
