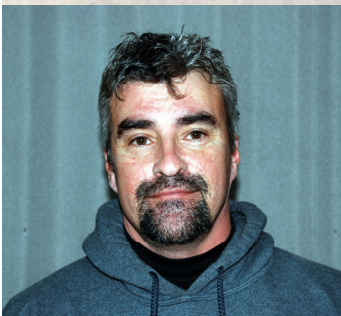

The official start to the astronomical spring begins March 20th but looking outside these days it is obvious it is here already, well at least for us out here in the west. With that in mind it seems timely to remind everyone of the following upcoming important dates:

April 11th Crane Day
April 25th Spring Clean-up
May 2nd and 3rd our annual Boat Show

Even if your boat isn't being lifted back into the water by the Armstrong Crane, you really should come down and check out Crane Day if you've never been or, even if you have. Pop down in the morning (it's often over shortly after lunch) and grab one of Corinne's fabulous breakfast sandwiches, they will be available for purchase from 8:30 on and Jay will be serving beverages commencing at 11:00. There's a lot of activity to watch as the 2015 boating season gets its start!

The sanitary pump-out and water service on the docks will be reactivated sometime during the week prior to Crane Day so both will be available for use effective Saturday April 11th onward.

Just like your home there is never a shortage of things to do around the Clubhouse, grounds and docks to get everything ready for the boating season so please do your part and come down early on Saturday April 25th to help out with Spring Clean-up, lunch will be provided to those that come out and volunteer. If you have suggestions for things you feel that need attending to around the facilities please be sure to email our friendly maintenance man Ken Smith at maintenance@vernonyachtclub.com so he can add it to the list.

I know you've heard it before but once again delivery and installation of the 8 new concrete fingers for C dock has been delayed but I have been assured these will be in place before the middle of March, well in advance of the start to the 2015 boating season.

Progress continues to be made on the small addition to the Clubhouse, needed to allow us to improve the efficiency of our kitchen. Pricing of it is getting close to being as finalized and it is expected a building permit will be applied for by the end of the first week of March with construction hopefully completed just in time for the 2015 Boat Show.

For the new breakwater progress is considerably slower but steps continue to be made to move this project along as well. Discussions have been had with the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations, an environmental engineer and one contractor so far.

The Vernon Yacht Club is just that, a Club it is not a commercial enterprise; we are all co-owners of this incredible facility and as such it should feel like an extension of our home, so make it yours. To paraphrase a line from a theme song for an old sitcom, *it's a place where everybody should know your name* and the way they get to know your name is by pitching in whenever possible, attending events put on at our Club and at other Clubs on the Lake and by just plain hanging around the docks, decks and Clubhouse.

Your 'Yacht Bucks' are available at the Gang Plank bar and restaurant now. This is the \$250 House Account fee you paid when you paid your club membership this year. This money comes right back to you in the form of a credit at the Gang

If you don't sign for your charges, your account will be debited for the amount owing plus a 10% gratuity for staff – this will be recorded and signed for by the bar manager.

Standards for securing boats at the Vernon Yacht Club Moorage Basin

The mooring standards as presented below are designed to prevent damage to your boat, damage to the VYC docks, and other boats.

You are asked to use appropriately sized mooring lines with snubbers of rubber or spring steel on lines of less than 10 feet in length. A properly secured boat will be held by a minimum of four lines. Attach lines correctly to cleats and keep snug so lines do not droop into the water. Use fenders to prevent contact of your boat with the dock or with other boats.

Terminology

Bow - the forward part of a boat.

Bow line - a docking line leading from the bow.

Chafing Gear - Tubing or leather wrapping used to protect a line from chafing on a rough surface.

Cleat - the metal fixture on the dock (or on your boat) used to attach lines to securely moor your boat.

Fender - A cushion, placed between boats, or between a boat and a dock, to prevent damage.

Line - the nautical term for ropes used in sailing and in securing your boat to a dock

Pile - A wood, metal or concrete pole driven into the ground.

Spring line - A line used in mooring to prevent the boat from moving forward or astern while made fast to a dock.

Snubber (rubber or spring steel) - a device attached to a mooring line to reduce shock to the boat and the dock.

Stern - the after or back part of a boat.

Stern line - a docking line leading from the stern.

Lines - can generally be categorized as follows:

Laid Nylon - a twisted line of nylon fibers may be used as a mooring line.

Single Braided or Double Braided Nylon (a braided core covered with a braided jacket) - are the best lines for moorage as they have good abrasion resistance and resistance to rot.

Polypropylene - (the common yellow rope) must **not** be used as a mooring line.

Size of Line recommended for Size of Boat

Boats to 20 feet	3/8 inch diameter line
Boats 20 to 35 feet	1/2 inch diameter line
Boats 35 to 45 feet	5/8 inch diameter line

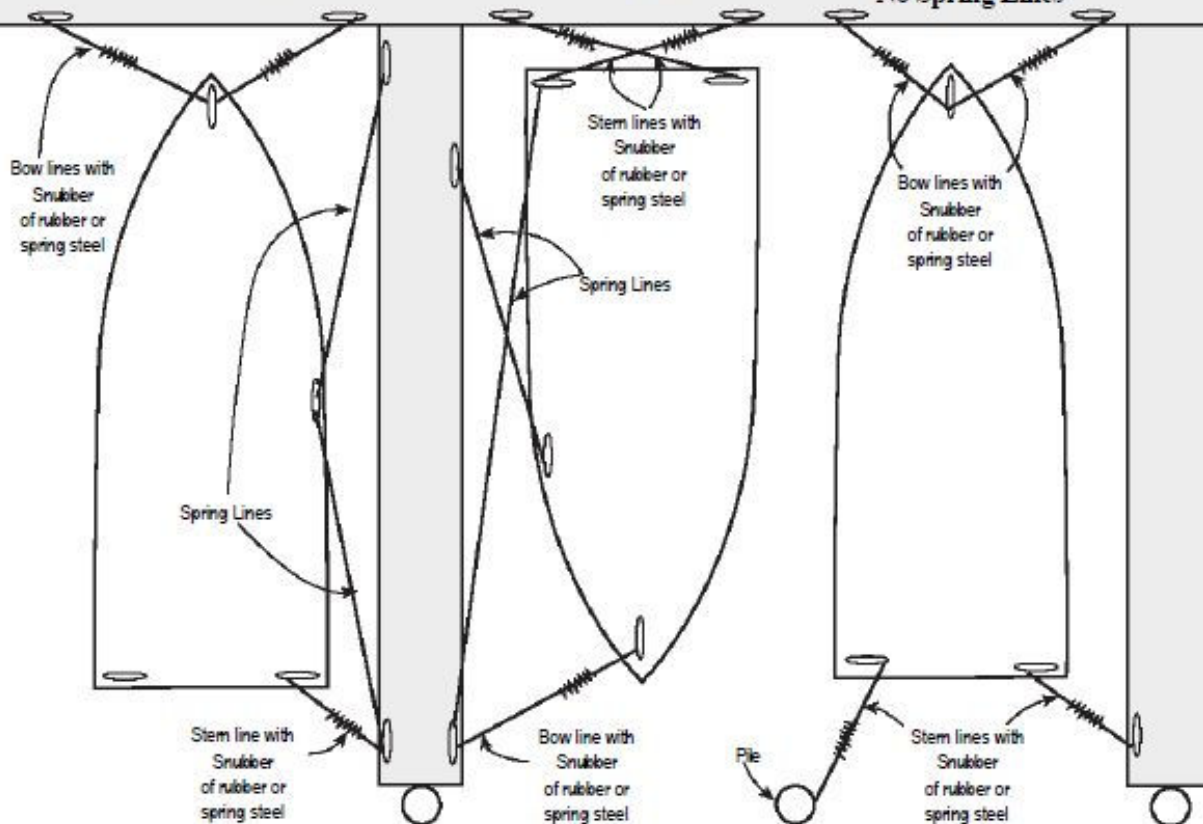

Square Tie No Spring Lines



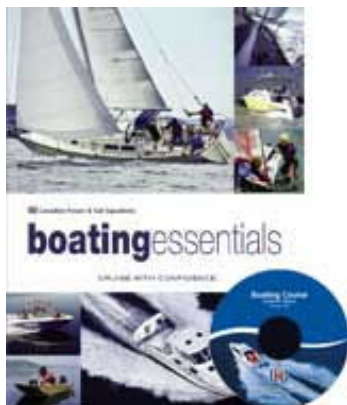

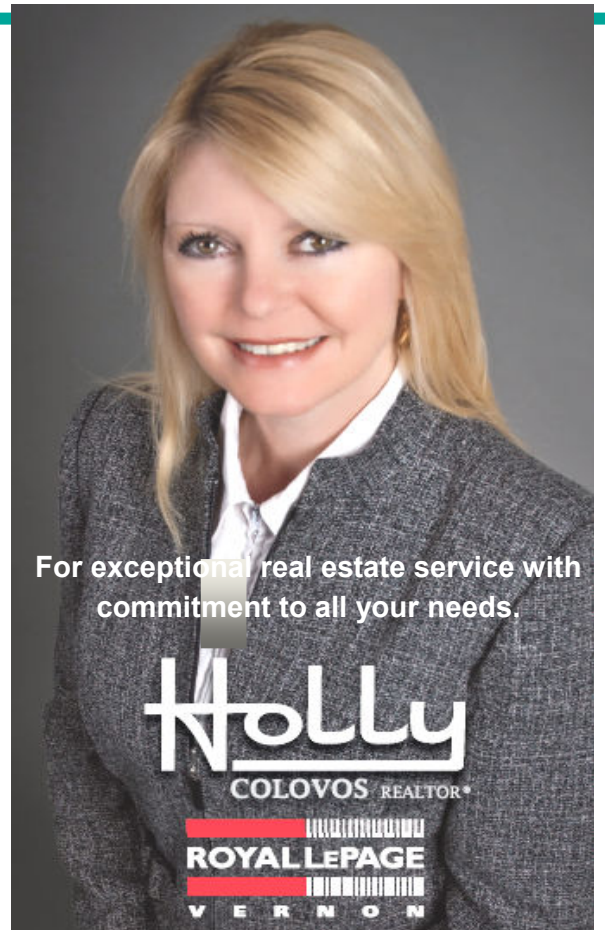

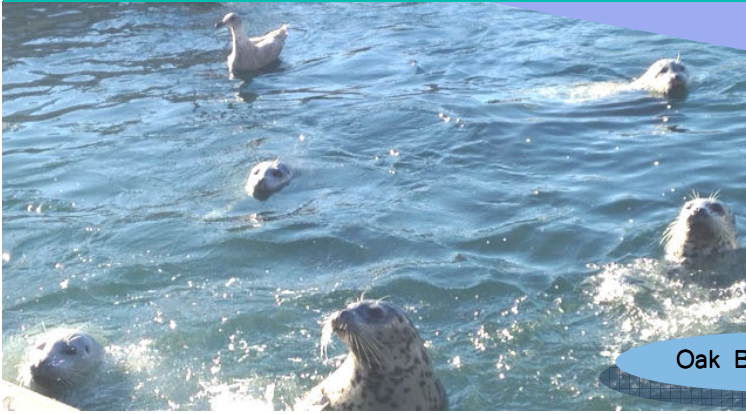

A Tale of a Trip

This story, as so many other stories begin with "we met these great people at the Vernon Yacht Club" a few years back, Brent Loshney and Manya Chernoff. You see, an instant friendship was formed when we came to know them after they bought "Destiny", a 26' O'day sailboat that was moored beside us on C dock. Unfortunately, it wasn't long after meeting our new found friends they sold Destiny and moved to Victoria where they bought a beautiful 32' Beneteau named "Mystere" and learned to sail among the many islands around them.

So many plans were made to travel to Victoria to visit Brent and Manya but were subsequently cancelled for one reason or another. Finally the stars aligned and we were able to take them up on an invitation to a weekend sail with them!

Our mini-holiday started at 5:59 a.m. Saturday morning as we pulled out of our frosty driveway headed to our destination; Latitude - 48.4222° N, Longitude - 123.3657° W.

First stop, Tsawwassen Ferry Terminal to catch the 1:00 sailing. I checked off an item on my bucket list that day that I didn't even know I had. Yup, I drove a Ferry, the Coastal Celebration. Timing is everything they say, whoever "they" are. We were standing in a hallway viewing a map of the ship when the Captain came through a door beside us and asked if we needed any direction. Craig pointed at the door he emerged from and said "well, can we go in there"? To make a long story short, he welcomed us into the Command Bridge where we seen the workings of a Ferry and learnt a bit about how it all operates. Then the navigator, one of the 5 on the bridge showed me how to steer! I would love to tell you I navigated the 160 meter long 10 ton ferry though Active Pass and docked it in Schwartz Bay but that would be a stretch! Reality is I adjusted the course of the Ferry using a joystick no bigger than what is used on a game controller! Super

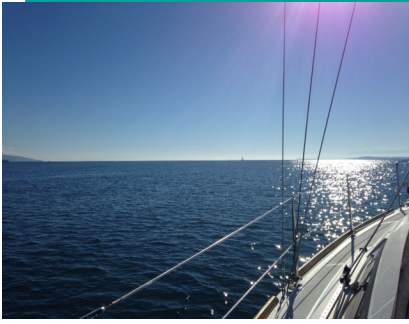
neat! Anyway, on to the purpose of our trip....

We arrived in Victoria around 4:30 pm and spent the evening visiting, provisioning and planning the route for our trip to begin Sunday Morning. We had a lovely meal at Brent and Manya's new club, the Royal Victoria Yacht Club.

We pulled out of the Oak Bay Marina around 8:30 Sunday morning headed for Poets Cove with the sun gleaming and a nice steady breeze blowing.

So many things happen on the ocean that one does not see on the lake. The first few miles we motored as we needed to push through the whirly pools that form in narrow passages of tidal waters. The strength of changing tides are simple amazing. We went from motoring 6.5 knots to .06 knots in areas! Once we passed through the whirlpools and Strong Tide Islet we were able to hoist the sails and peacefully cruise in just under 10 knots of wind. There was a seemingly never ending stream of freighters and navy ships that we watched in the not-so-far distance. Around 2:00 that afternoon we decided to change our destination as we were not quite half way to Poets Cove and the wind was dying. One cannot be in a rush on a sailboat!



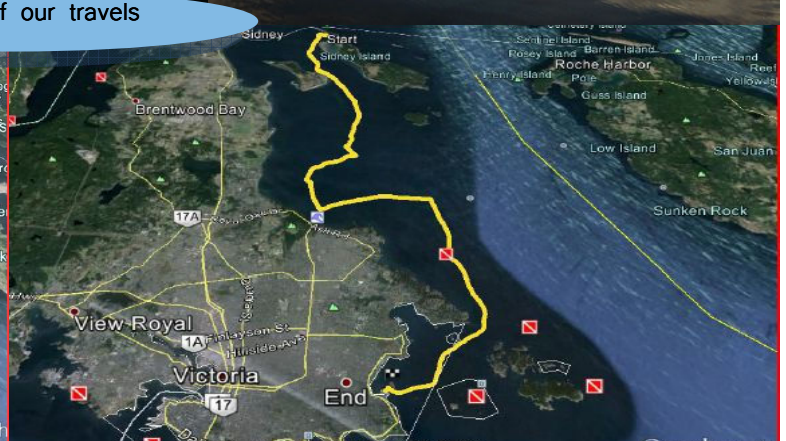
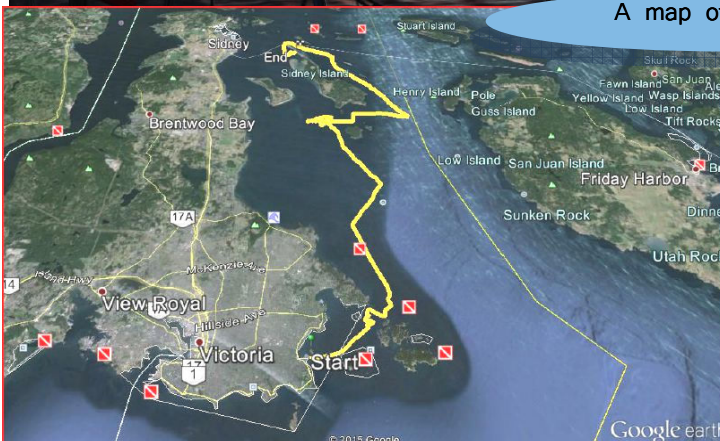
