Hello members.

This last weekend, Jill and I had the privilege of representing our Club at the **Peach Land Yacht Club Commodores** dinner and get together and, like every year, they provided an amazing meal, friendship and good times. Our Peach Land friends do not have a Club House but that does not stop them from being an enthusiastic and friendly Club. They also recently completed a major breakwater refurbishment and expansion, which they contracted out to **Shoreline Pile Driving** who did a fantastic Job. The expansion allowed them

to add some new slips for larger vessels as well as a new, easily approachable visitor's slip. It also gives **Peach Land Yacht Club** the opportunity to provide a free slip for a larger rescue vessel, which is very important because apparently, 75 percent of the rescues on Okanagan Lake are to respond to distress calls from the area between Squally Point and Rattlesnake Island. Having the rescue boat available from Peach land's Marina will dramatically shorten rescue response times at the South end of our lake. Good to know if any of our boaters need help at the South end of the run when we have the **"End To End" sailing race** on the weekend of September 18-20.

On another note, our **Captain's Care Club** hosted yet another successful **Rib-Off** event last weekend. Jill and I were at the Club on Friday night and had an opportunity to review the many **Silent Auction** items donated by some very generous Club Members. We also staffed the door and were available to show members to their reserved tables and while doing so; we were made aware that some long-term members still did not know of the existence or the reason for Captain's Care Club. So for those members as well as our new members: the **Captain's Care Club** is essentially a Club within our Club and all of our members are automatically enrolled. Saturday, August 15th 2015

Saturday night, August 15th, the Vernon Yacht Club (VYC), Captain's Care Club hosted 104 members and guests to their annual BBQ Rib-Off competition. Preparation for VYC's annual 'Rib-Off' began early in the week with three volunteer home chefs and their volunteer sous chefs picking up their ribs up at Griller Meats in downtown Vernon. Each team using their personal favorite recipe were required to cook 30 racks of ribs and to present their best three rib portions to the judges by 6:15 pm, Saturday evening. In past years, the event has been advertised as a "Battle of the Sexes", this year based on comments received; it was decided to have the home chefs compete against each other for the coveted VYC Master Chef and Sous-Chef 2015 apron. Unfortunately, due to other commitments the competition was reduced to three competing teams with the VYC kitchen staff forming a non-competitive 4th team. Though, the kitchen staff did not partake in the competition they did produce a rib dish that complemented the superb BBQ'd ribs presented by our competitive chefs. At 5:30 pm the chefs and sous-chefs began their grilling preparation in anticipation of the judging and of the guests attending the sold out event.

Following dinner, our members and their guests were treated to the music of Barbara Samuels, who with her husband presented a mixed collection of dancing music to the full enjoyment of all. Included in the evening festivities were a 50/50 draw with the winner taking home \$220.00 and a silent auction of donated items, which members and guests placed bids on, in an effort to take home the items. The Captain's Care Club would like to thank Master Chef Cynthia Fox, Sous-chef Rudy, Chef Susan Matthews, Sous-chef Megan Fox and Chef Greg Larsen and Sous-chef Terry. Each team received the VYC Chef apron in recognition for the hard work and effort they put in to ensure success of this well attended event. A special mention of thanks goes to Corrine Kirton and her kitchen staff who made up for our short fall of chef teams by cooking up the remaining racks of ribs. In total 143 racks of ribs were cooked and presented to the buffet table for all to enjoy. 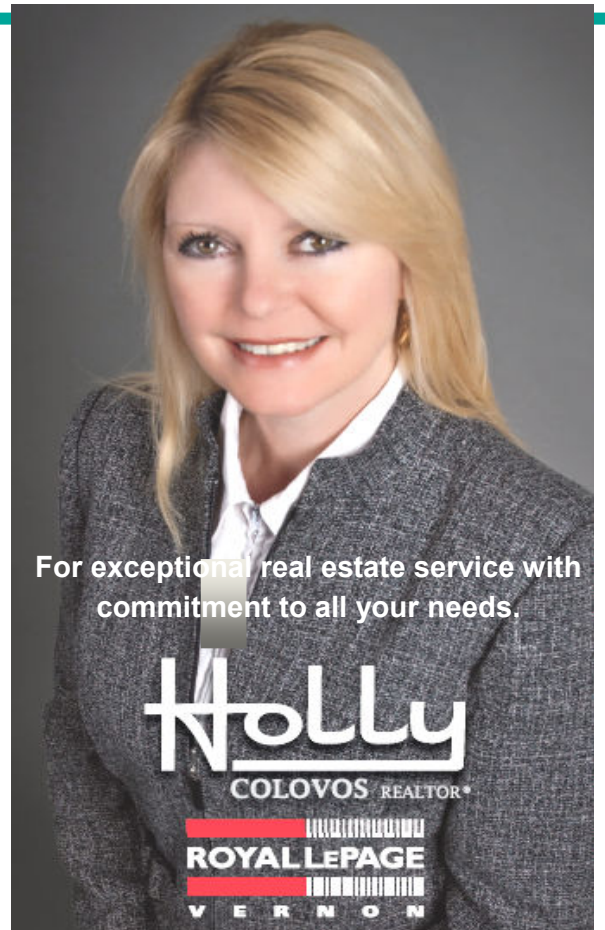

HOUSE & GROUNDS DIRECTOR



Rex Landis

I have been working on several projects:

Some of the projects are the landscaping at the front of the property as well as the front of the building and the new sloped bank from construction.

The continued development of the west front of the property, adjacent to the new construction. This will give us more member parking and a fenced area for the garbage bin.

The pavement repair and paving the secondary access to the entrance of the property, including blocking that access with break-away chain for emergency.

The extension of the front deck by up to 16 feet. The future development of a proper maintenance

area usable by members for small repairs under cover.

Another project is the ongoing change of lighting to LED, particularly on the docks. I am led to believe that we can reduce the power consumption of lighting by a minimum 20%. Should this be true this will be a significant reduction in cost for us; and we simply can change this lighting as the lights require replacing which we usually do every spring. We still qualify for a hydro assistance package on this.

I have received a quote for the landscaping for the front bank. The work to be done is very extensive and will be phased over the next few years. This fall we expect to install 4-6 cm trees (2 1/2 inch) at the bottom of the tree. The trees are Ivory Silk which produce a pale yellow

type lilac for 3 weeks. These are dwarf trees and only grow to 17 feet eliminating the need to prune from hydro lines.

We are continuing the budget and long term planning for the next year and beyond. Should you have any sound ideas for us please use the suggestion box at the Gangplank. Also as a reminder we do have maintenance request forms should you see something that needs attention.
