

All boats with trailers must be parked on the East side of the property. *Please park within 2 feet of your neighbours*.

Only boats without trailers are allowed parking on the gravel section.

Cameron point was picked because often The bay in front of our yacht club has very light air , however on this occasion that was not the case . The start time was set at 8.30 pm , the racing instruction was for those boats who had radios to monitor channel 28, but we found that for some reason no-one could communicate on 28. I suggested changing to channel 6 but some skippers were uncomfortable going against the sailing instructions . Having to hail to the boats, I made the decision that prior to the start we would monitor channel 6 , then after the start switching to 28 .

Several boats were late getting to the starting area, so I postponed the race for 30 minutes ,, By 9 am all the boats were in place, I had set up for a one start with a start line of about 150 meters . The start was clean , with a fairly strong south wind and all boats making good time .

I really enjoyed the experience, and all the visitors seemed to have enjoyed their time in Vernon and the wind helped make the whole race a fun time, its always a good time when we have the southern yacht clubs send members up to us and we so enjoy having them.


