
And, significantly, the work of the Security Team remains an important





#### **Boating Essentials - our newest course!**

Already got your PCOC? Then you're ready to take the next step! Boating Essentials takes up where PCOC training left off. Additional and more detailed information on anchoring, 'Rules of the Road' and on Marine Aids to Navigation. Introduction to Marine Navigation skills, including chart reading and interpretation, plotting your course and finding the safest route.

Join us for a 10 week experience, on Monday evenings, commencing February 18.

**Sailing** - The Sailing Course provides the knowledge required to operate a sailboat safely. Building upon the skills gained in Seamanship, this course will acquaint the beginner with day-sailing in protected waters, and sharpen the skills of more experienced sailors.

Emphasis is placed on how a sailboat works and the special terminology associated with sailboats, sailing, and practical seamanship. The particular problems of piloting under sail, and making progress to windward are discussed.

The course is once a week on Monday evenings for 8 - 10 weeks, commencing April 22, until June 24.

#### The Maritime Radio Course

The course leads to the VHF Marine Radio operators certification, the ROC(M), which is legally required to operate a VHF Radio on the water. The course will be presented Tuesday evening, May 7, plus the full Saturday, May 11, 2013. Register on-line, or call Doug at 250-549-5117.

## **Minutes Summary**

March 2013

he Okanagan Landing Volunteer Fireman's Association in conjunction with Vernon Search and Rescue, made a presentation, during which they requested keeping their rescue and fire boat in a slip at the Vernon Yacht Club.

They are the nearest search and rescue agency and having a slip in the water provides a quicker response time to service calls.

This department falls under the EMBC (Emergency Management British Columbia) of which 24 individuals are on call at all times.

It currently takes search and rescue 16 minutes response time to get to Kal Lake and 25 minutes to get to Okanagan Lake. The Okanagan fire department, having a boat in the water will speed up the response time significantly. Typically they receive 12 to 30 calls per year and most are boats that have drifted loose or run out of gas, but they have also assisted in recovery efforts.

ke received complaints of loud behaviour and foul language from the membership. Mike has decided to ask Jay the bar manager to enforce Item #3 of our House Rules of Conduct which will place our club in Compliance with Workers Compensation, the Liquor Control Board, and health board regulations. In addition to this, the executive members need to be on the lookout for unruly behaviour and act in support or our bar staff.

Lawrence mentioned that Marnie has holidays from March 18-22<sup>nd</sup> and April 18-23.

**Spring cleanup is scheduled for April 20** in time for the boat show May 4 but after **Crane Day April 13th**. Jerry will make sure the majority of the boats leave the parking lot that day. Lunch will be provided for volunteers

Ron asked Jerry about member cards being in the possession of members not in good standing and suggests they be deactivated until their accounts are brought up to date.

Lawrence will ask Marnie to send out notification of deactivation with a deadline of payment by March 31.

Jerry announced that crane day is April 13 and he will notify membership about this in the Tiller Topics. Jerry will remind all of those using winter slips to vacate those slips and move back to their original slips before crane day.

On April 15, in addition to boats being lifted into the water, all boats need to be removed from the parking lot for spring cleanup.

Jam night is scheduled for the third Friday of each month except for this month where it is scheduled for next Friday March 22.

This year is the 60<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the VYC and Val is arranging to celebrate the occasion at the Commodore's Ball.

Next Executive meeting scheduled for April 9<sup>th</sup>.




# Tentative OK For Yacht Club

An application by the Vernon Yacht club for a relaxation of regulations regarding the erection of buildings close to the high water mark on Okanagan Lake was heard Tuesday by the Vernon Regulated Area Appeal Board.

Present regulations prohibit the construction of a building within 50 feet of the high water mark. The Yacht Club is planning to build a new club house and wish to place the building on the shoreline of the lake.

Members of the appeal board tentatively approved the application at their meeting Tuesday.

Approval is subject to waivers from neighbors on either side of the property, located at Okanagan Landing.

#### Yacht Club Gets Started On Brand New Clubhouse

Members of Vernon's Yacht Club are progressing well in their efforts to build a new home for the club down at Okanagan Landing, Commodore Blair Jackson said yesterday in an interview.

Work on the club's new \$10,000 headquarters is in the foundation stage, with the footings already poured and the foundation wall forms now being put in place.

Pouring of the concrete foundations is expected to be done over the November 11 week-end, Mr. Jackson said.

A number of the club's 68 members have been busy with the foundation work and more are expected to pitch in when the foundation is completed and the beams and rafters start going up.

"Things should go along at a pretty fair clip then", the Commodore reports.

Scheduled to be completed in time for the Okanagan Regatta next summer, the new building will be 34 x 62 feet overall, with a 30 x 40 foot hall, complete with fireplace and picture window across one end.

Other features will be double sets of powder rooms and men's washrooms, lockers for the members, complete kitchen facilities, a lounge and a bar.

The work will all be done by volunteer labor, with some of the

## members in the contracting business landing a hand with equipment.

One big attraction of the building will be a cantilever front porch, over the waters of Okanagan Lake.

The present clubhouse, a mere 15 x 15 feet in comparison with the sizeable new structure, may be turned over to a group of teenage yachtsmen, if present plans materialize.

Future plans for the property include the building next year of a breakwater to harbor boats and seaplanes. The club has a lease on the water front lot for this purpose.

Security will be stepped up a little


during the show, and I know any support you can offer to patrol the extra hours would be well accepted.
