Since inception 3 years ago, Ron and the security team have greatly reduced theft and vandalism at the VYC. Please remember that security of property is a shared responsibility. VYC supports the members security team in providing 'boots on the ground' security all year. VYC provides video surveillance of the docks, grounds and building and various alarms on the property. Individual members can consider installing intruder alarms on their vessels, removing easily portable items from their vessels and leave no

alcohol on board, it is a prime attractant for thieves and vandals. Get to know your neighbours, notice and report unusual activity to Ron or the office.

The clubs holding tank pump out on D dock is open to use by VYC boaters and to non members at no charge, part of the shared purchase agreement VYC has with North Okanagan Regional District.

Allen and Mary-Ann Dubeski have just taken delivery of their new baby, a Beneteau 40, fresh out of the factory, now out on D dock. Trucked to and launched at Shelter Bay, it was uncertain she would clear the Bennett bridge. Allen filled all tanks to lower the vessel, hauled a brokers agent to the top of the mast to observe clearance close up, and slooooowly edged

Vice Commodore's Report

Hello and welcome to all our new members as well as those who have been with us for some time.

Does your boat have a VHF radio? If not, for safety sake, your

Club strongly advises you to get one as soon as possible. Because your own boat may need assistance or you may be able to help another boater in distress. By the way, you are **legally obligated** to help someone who needs help. [You should help only as long as you do not endanger your boat or the distressed boater.]

Choices: You can choose between a portable hand held radio or one which is permanently installed in your dashboard or chart table area. Handheld radios are satisfactory but have limited range due to lower transmitting power. Once you get your radio, you should attend one of our courses which offer the Restricted Operator's Certificate [Maritime].

This course is important because it will legally enable you to use your radio. Call Doug Stewart at [250] 549 5117 for more information on the course.

Incidentally, our Club Lounge monitors VHF channel 16, so if you are out on the lake and attempting to return to the Club and your slip under higher than normal wind conditions, you would be able to call the Club [Vernon Yacht Club, Vernon Yacht Club, Vernon Yacht Club] and either someone at the Club or someone tied up on their own slip but monitoring channel 16 can respond to your call, go to your slip, and grab your docking lines for you. This is just one of the many circumstances where your radio could help you.

While you are thinking about safety afloat, you should also check the Transport Canada Safe Boating Guide to find out what the minimum safety requirements are for your particular boat. Finally, you must have a Pleasure Craft Operator Card before you can legally operate your boat. If your boat is checked by the authorities and found to be deficient in the recommended safety requirements or your P.C. Operators Card, you will be fined. Please be safe out there.

Messing About in Boats by Dave Atkins

"There's none as deaf as them as won't hear"

That is an expression I heard often when growing up in England. That was before the days of TV in every house, (not even in one house,) and personal electronic radios and communicators did not exist, but it came to mind the other day when I was watching the local TV news. On the first long weekend of summer the Police and Coast Guard set up inspections of pleasure boats on Okanagan and Shuswap Lakes. They found that half the people checked did not have the mandatory Pleasure Craft Operators Card. (PCOC).

It has been over ten years since the program was introduced and there has been advertising and courses and "pay if you pass" set ups all over the place but still about half the boating public "don't know we had to have that card!!" One has to conclude that generally people figure that "it doesn't apply to ME." As a member of Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons and a CYA sailing instructor I have been teaching boating safety for many years and I like to think that it is worthwhile to do so, but how do you get to the people who don't want to know? Even many who have taken the test and got the card didn't learn any boating safety, they just wanted to get the card the easiest way possible.

Every year some people drown or are injured in boating mishaps. I won't call them accidents because that implies that there was no one at fault. I wonder if the ones that drown would still believe that they don't need any boating training?

Water is not our natural environment. We cannot breath in water, most often it is below our body temperature and will cool us down, which might be OK on a hot summer day for a limited time but for extended periods it is harmful. We seem to have a fascination with water and go on holidays to be near it and buy homes that border on the water. We buy boats so that we can use the water for fishing, go sailing or skiing etc. Why are so many people reluctant to educate themselves about safety and or having learned, ignore the lessons. having fun somehow counter to personal safety? There are many who are very careful about what they do on the water and their enjoyment is enhanced by the lack of risk, but there are others who think that those "silly regulations" are going to spoil their fun. Which group do you fall into? I hope it is the first one. Happy and safe boating.

We signaled that all was now under control, however in retrospect I realize just how cold we had become as it took us quite a while to get our muscles working to lift our boat on to our car.

I want to extend my and my sons THANKS to your members for standing by and ensuring that total strangers were safe and sound!

- Your Marine VHF Radio is an important piece of safety equipment
- Every boat operator has an obligation to monitor Channel
 16, if the boat is equipped with a VHF Radio
- Every person operating a VHF Marine Radio must have a Restricted Operator's Certificate (Maritime), commonly referred to as ROC(M)
- Every boater has a moral and legal obligation to assist another vessel in distress, so long as his own vessel and crew is not endangered
- If you hear a "Mayday" or a "PanPan" call on the radio, stand by and be prepared to assist

Many calls come to the Vernon Yacht Club's radio ... please do what you can to assist your fellow boater!

Get your ROC(M) certification. Take the VHF Radio Course from CPS
