yours and mine. So this will be short. Your Executive is going flat out, and coming up fast is the Clubs Annual Gen-

eral Meeting on Monday November 29 at 7 pm. The agenda will be comparatively short with at least two issues for you to decide and vote on.

The Club has in the past awarded life time membership to a few members whose contributions have been particularly significant. It has been many years since this award has been made and all but one life time member has passed on.

There are many who make significant contributions to the Club and no doubt identifying any one member is likely to give rise to differences of opinion. This year the Executive received a petition from members suggesting the award be made and, as required in By-laws, the Executive unanimously supported the suggested candidate. The award gives the member annual membership without payment of annual dues, but does not include moorage. If we can recognize and give awards for those who fall in the water, it seems only right that we honour those whose contributions provide great benefit to the Club. Views expressed on this matter at the AGM will demonstrate the true spirit of the Club members.

You will also be asked to consider the matter of continuing the renewal and expansion of the docks. The wood docks B and C are beyond their expected life. You will be asked to vote yes or no to borrow up to \$450,000 to renew B dock and temporarily extend C dock with wood from B dock, work projected to commence early 2011 with completion early spring 2011. It will be your decision to proceed or not.

Elsewhere (page 10) in this newsletter is a notice of members who have agreed to let their names stand as nominees for your 2011 Executive. This will also need your consideration. Remember, we get the government we deserve, sometimes better than we deserve.

Please put **Monday November 29, 7 pm** on your calendar, set your alarm clock if necessary, and attend.

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At this time of year most of boating is of the the "armchair" variety, and one tends to revisit previous experiences and cruises that stay in the memory. It is a pleasant pastime and tends to prompt the plans for next season. That is a good thing. Some of this depends on the depth of experience and that will depend on age and opportunity. As I have 50 years of experience in boating there are a lot of memories to draw from and of course we tend to keep the good ones most of all.

I first went sailing with two of my cousins on the rivers of Norfolk in England. In is called the "Norfolk Broards" and is a flat area of slow moving rivers and shallow lakes. We had a 26 ft. sailboat and my older cousin was the experienced sailor. The boat had no motor and when there was no wind you moved the boat with a long pole which you put in the river bottom and walked the boat forward along the deck. It was called "quanting" and I have no idea where the name came from. One of my best memories of that trip was sailing the boat by myself, up the river, when my cousins had to go overland to the

next village for some reason.

I returned to the Rivers some years later when on a visit to England. This time I was was with my brother and brother-in-



with my brother and brother-inlaw and we were staying at a local pub. We had rented a day-sailer from the next village so had to drive up there but I was nominated to take the car back and I would hitch a ride back on a boat! I walked to the river bank and found three young fellows with a sail boat pinned to a lee shore and without the experience to get back into the river. I offered to help in exchange for a ride up to the next village. OK. The young fellows had no previous experience and were quite grateful to have the help. As we sailed up river the helmsman spotted a power boat cruising down with many "

Bathing Beauties" draped over the deck and cabin top. As he watched,

distracted, the tiller followed his gaze and had I not been there he would have had a collision with the other boat. Great teaching opportunity to emphasize the responsibilities of the skipper.

We went back for a

visit a few years ago and in our travels around between various family members we went to the "Broards" It has changed in 50 years, not surprisingly, and there are very few sailboats on the rivers now but lots of long narrow cruising powerboats, but the villages are still quaint and the windmills are still turning. I still have the pictures to remind me, and I was able to digitize my 35mm transparencies, so they rotate by in random order as a screen saver on my computer, it helps keep the memories alive.

Moving the band area out of the corner, adding some sound deadening window coverings and placing some soft furniture groupings seemed to make a noticeable difference. Being able to carry on a conversation while the band was playing was a real pleasure and the dance floor was still full at the end of the night. And speaking of Halloween parties there just has to be a big hug for Betty Labelle, "decorator extraordinaire". We didn't have a prize for best costume but my vote certainly would have gone to the clubhouse itself. We now have a state of the art system that should serve the club well for many years.

While the next topic may not have the glamour of, oh say, a shiny new pump-out facility the first annual VYC Fire Extinguisher Day seemed to be well received by members. The board room table was covered in fire extinguishers of every description, and I mean every description. There were some that looked like they would have been more effective as rolling pins than fire extinguishers and a few that looked like they might have come with the easy bake oven your little sister got in 1971. Yours truly got the Oldest Fire Extinguisher award for his vintage 1961 model ... and no he would not recharge/ recertify that one. I know there were more than a few that were rejected because of age or type but this was all part of the plan. I don't have the number of extinguishers that were recertified for another year but it was certainly enough to justify planning another VYC Fire Extinguisher Day for next year. Since you need to have one or more fire extinguishers on board anything more elaborate than a canoe or rowboat, yes even a PWC, it is worthwhile staying one step ahead of your insurance adjuster and educating yourself on just what is necessary. And speaking of safety - check out the new additions to the west breakwater. There are now ten, count 'em, ten yellow lights flashing at the required once every four seconds pattern. This is a proactive step taken by your executive to ensure that we are able to demonstrate a decidedly proactive attitude when it comes to the safety of the boating public. These latest additions are the current generation of the totally encapsulated lights we have been using up to now. While the old ones have performed well they are a "throw-away" product when they quit. The new ones have the advantage of being totally programmable and include a replaceable battery.

If you have any ideas about safety inside or outside our marina please feel free to email me and I will research it for this column. I look forward to seeing many of you at the upcoming Annual General Meeting. Come out and vote. The club functions best when members get involved.
