Vernon Power & Sail Squad-

June, 2013



Didja' Know? CPS-ECP had its start in 1938, when three members of the Windsor Yacht Club crossed the Ambassador Bridge into Detroit, Michigan. Under the direction of the Detroit Power Squadron, the three passed the USPS Junior Piloting Course. They soon formed the first Squadron in Canada, Windsor Power Squadron, with G. William Bowman as its first Commander. Bowman later became the first Chief Commander of Canadian Power Squadrons, the organization that, later, became known as Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons. By 1950, the membership had doubled. In 2013, as we begin our anniversary year, CPS-ECP has 26,000 members in 155 squadrons across Canada. Over the organization's 75 years, over 850,000 boaters have taken a 'Power Squadron' course.

During 2013, CPS-ECP will celebrate the 75th anniversary. But CPS-ECP is more than just an iconic organization, and our history is woven from the stories of each individual who is or was a member.

The CPS-ECP **Boating Basics** Course is one of the very last PCOC courses to be provided in a classroom setting.



This Transport Canada approved course provides you with the knowledge required to successfully complete your Pleasure Craft Operator Card exam. One evening session plus one full Saturday of instruction, followed by the PCOC exam. The \$65.00 fee includes the Handbook, exam fee and registration with Transport Canada.

This is a recommended companion course for Boating Essentials, which introduces navigation techniques.



May Approve Breakwater at Landing

May Approve Breakwater At Landing

Residents of Okanagan Landing – and visiting boat owners – may have a new \$35,000 breakwater next year, if present plans of the department of public works materialize.

Commodore Blair Jackson of the Vernon Yacht Club, has been advised in a letter from Hon. Howard C. Green, Federal Minister of public works, that plans for the breakwater at the Landing have been listed for consideration in the supplementary estimates now being prepared, which will be placed before Parliament shortly.

If approved, the project may be started this winter or early next spring, when lower lake levels will facilitate breakwater construction.

Mr. Green said in his letter, received in Vernon last week, that the work cannot be proceeded with until it has been included in estimates and approved in the House. "We were unable to reach a decision following the investigation in time to have the Okanagan Landing item included in the main estimates for this year", he explained.

The proposed breakwater would provide

shelter for an estimated 100 boats, and would be a boon to boat owners visiting the North Okanagan as well as members of the local yacht club, Mr. Jackson said.

NO ANCHORAGE NOW

At present there is no protected anchorage in the area.


Both Penticton and Kelowna have breakwaters built by the department.

It is expected the T-shaped breakwater will extend from the road allowance next to the Yacht Club building and would provide ample mooring space outside the Club's present wharf and launching ramp.

The Yacht Club has been asking for breakwater facilities over the past seven years.

KELOWNA SWEEPS THE VYC REGATTA!!

The last three races of the day were in a light breeze. After a delicious dinner prepared by Corinne at VYC, the sailors danced the night away to the fabulous sounds of the McKinleys. It was a gala party to start the summer season as the Vernon Yacht Club and the Okanagan Quality Life Society joined up to kickoff the Heaven Can Wait II replacement pontoon boat fundraising initiative. Over one hundred VYC and OQLS members and friends came out to generously support the program to purchase a new pontoon boat to replace the aging Heaven Can Wait which has served so faithfully since 1992. An absolutely outstanding success, the event raised close to \$8,000.

Notably, the idea to have a fundraiser was spawned during the VYC Boat Show. Denise Dobie, who had purchased the local band "The Goods" at the Kalamalka Rotary Dream Auction, heard of the OQLS initiative to purchase a new pontoon boat, so she spoke with OQLS Vice President Gerald Gustafson and Commodore Mike Thomas and suggested a June 21st Summer Solstice fundraising dinner/dance and she would donate the band. A committee chaired by Gerald was quickly assembled and the rest, as they say, is history. Tickets were quickly sold out, and the Vernon and area community responded in fine fashion to requests by donating 85+ Silent Auction items. An excellent dinner was catered by Corrine and Carol in the VYC kitchen with Jay and Chanel keeping everyone happy at the bar. Bob and Ken carved up and served the roast beef. Many thanks, everyone was thoroughly satisfied.

Generously, the attendees responded to MC Mike Thomas' prompting to visit the 'Silent Auction' tables, and/or give a direct donation. The auction items fetched 75% of their value (60% is considered a success) and over \$3,000 was donated directly. Add in a 'share the funds' draw of \$456.00 and the Summer Solstice fundraiser was a huge success.

Significantly, the Vernon Yacht Club members have supported the OQLS Heaven Can Wait program by providing moorage and use of facilities since 1994. The OQLS was formed in 1992 to purchase a 24' pontoon boat to take seniors confined to long term residences (such as: Noric House, Gateby, and Polson Extendicare) and disabled members of the Vernon and area community on therapeutic boat rides on Okanagan Lake. The program has proved to be a wonderful success providing so much on water joy to the residents.

The VYC and OQLS would like to thank all the generous support received during this fundraiser event. Our goal of raising \$40,000 dollars to have Heaven Can Wait II in the water ready for the 2014 season has been given a tremendous send off. Loads of thanks to Gerald and his committee for making this a "fun" event.
