The editorial

in the March edition of '48\* North' sailing magazine notes that, across North America, boating or yacht clubs used to be family places where kids ab-

sorbed the boating life and perpetuated their club. It notes that today, boat/yacht clubs are inhabited and perpetuated primarily by the older, grey haired folks. This is a familiar theme in much of the boating world; Canadian Power and Sail Squadron reports the aging of its membership; marine surveyors are having increasing difficulty climbing into small spaces on board vessels and even greater difficulty climbing out.

You will be happy to note that this is not the case at VYC where only four of your executive have grey hair. And these four tend to be some of the Club's most progressive thinkers.

Which brings us to the subject of The Commodore's Ball and Sail Past. We are a boating organization and have invited Tom Lewis, a very talented professional entertainer, to bring us a morning of sea shanties and maritime stories. Tom served in the Royal Navy, traveling below the waves for many years, and now travels the world above water playing and singing. (see poster in this newsletter or on line at tom@lewis.net)

You have always wanted to know about Pollywogs and Shellbacks! Who is Mother Carey and does she in fact have chickens and what does Davey Jones keep in his locker ? Tom is the man to ask. May 8 is your chance to find out.

And also for your enjoyment, members Casey and Hanny Kooyman have arranged for 40 members of the Salmon Arm Community Band to play prior to the 2 pm Sail Past. From a location near the club flag pole this group will blow you away with such favourites as Honky Tonk Ragtime, Moonlight Serenade, Copacabana and others.

And for those of you with dual addictions, you can be boating at 2 pm and golfing at 5 pm. Honour your club on Saturday, your Mummy on Sunday.





his is the Month when the weather gets warmer and it may even get hot, and thoughts turn to getting back on the water for some fun. Some hardy young people figure that they should be able to go swimming on the May 24<sup>th</sup> weekend, but I think that most people like to wait a little longer. However most of the boaters are starting to get out on the water and enjoy the great opportunities that the lakes offer us.

When we go and play on the water we mostly don't think of PFDs or Life Jackets. I know people put on a flotation vest to go water skiing, but generally take it off when they get back in the boat, or give it to the next skier, thinking that the danger from the water no longer exists once they are back in the boat. I read recently that there is a move to make it compulsory to WEAR life jackets in boats under 6 meters, that is just under 20ft. That would include a large number of run-abouts that we see on the lake,

generally filled with a number of people wearing the minimum of clothing, let alone life jackets. This ruling is backed up by the statistics which show that most drownings occur from boats under 6 meters. Of course, you say, but that wouldn't happen on Okanagan Lake in the summer when its warm enough to swim ashore. Wrong.

Drowning can happen very suddenly when you fall into the water unexpectedly. The body has a shock response that causes you to gasp for air as you hit the water, if your mouth is under when that happens, you can gasp in a half liter of water which is enough to flood your lungs and kill you!!!. If you have put on your PFD it is most likely that you will not submerge enough to have your face in the water, so that when you gasp you will take in AIR. Remember playing in the water may be fun but we are not designed to live in the water and just because you can swim like a fish doesn't mean that you can live like one as well.

Think about it when someone tells you to put on a life jacket and you reply "I wouldn't be seen dead in one of those things" you will probably be right.






#### First Annual 'Rite of Spring' - Burning of the Socks


