### Commodore's Report Tim Amy



#### As mentioned

last month, the
Vernon Yacht Club's
immediate
neighbour to the
west at 7941
Okanagan Landing
Rd. has expressed
interest in selling his
lot and house to
VYC. Your Executive members have
considered this pos-

sibility and following is a summary of the findings:

The lot is 50' wide, fronting on Okanagan Landing Rd. and extending 150' to water front on Okanagan Lake. There is a house on the lot. Access to the lot and house is by elevated wood walkway with no vehicle access directly onto the lot, vehicle parking is limited to street side. Tax assessed value for 2011 was \$694,000 There is a small dock on the beach and the property has no water lease assigned.

The Clubs financial institution estimates that VYC has sufficient cash flow to obtain financing for this purchase. It would increase VYC total debt to approximately \$1,800,000, close to maximum.

Potential of this property for VYC purposes: The lot on land would extend VYC property 50' to the west, placing VYC west property line very close to the home on the next lot west. The home could be rented for income to assist with repayment. The lot could be cleared for additional VYC parking or to enable a new clubhouse to be built further west. The residential neighbours west of 7941 would be impacted by a club house built closer to their residence. Public response would be likely. A new building on the lot would be subject to 100' set back from high water mark.

Purchase of the lot at 7941 MIGHT facilitate application for a water lease to extend VYC moorage to the west. There is no guarantee a water lease would be granted. If granted the water lease would extend VYC approximately 50' west of the existing concrete breakwater. The breakwater can be moved and

re-anchored. The breakwater is 12' wide and is currently anchored 15' from A Dock. Moving the breakwater 50' west would increase the space from A Dock to 50'+15' -12'= 53' Fingers could be added to west side of A Dock. The west side of A Dock is subject to greater wind and wave action not suited to smaller vessels. Boats moored west of A Dock would need to be 25'-30' to withstand considerable wave action which passes under the breakwater and is currently dampened by A Dock. 25'-30' fingers west of A Dock would leave 28-23' turning room for vessels backing out between A Dock and the breakwater. At least 30' turning room is needed for vessels that size.

#### Conclusions;

VYC could obtain the financing and meet cash flow requirements, but close to maximum debt load. This would have implications for next phase of renewing the docks (\$300,000) The 50'x150' land lot would be of limited use in short term. Obtaining extended water lease to the west is not guaranteed, and subject to public input. Moving the breakwater 50'would not provide adequate room to expand moorage to west.

The Executive is unanimous in recommending that VYC not pursue purchase of the lot. Members wishing to pursue this may gather information and call a Special General meeting to consider the matter.

And on other matters, remember, the Club's dining lounge will continue to provide food services in addition to the long standing Friday evenings.

Rear Commodore Lawrence Johnson has his hands full. The pumpout, recently damaged by a large vessel impacting it, is under repair and will be operational next season. The north end of the west break water recently broke some anchor lines and damaged its dolphins, putting it over budget for the year. Its annual maintenance has averaged \$30,000 for several years. In my opinion the north sections are too buoyant, underweight for the wave action and will continue to incur high maintenance costs.

The Annual General meeting is set for Monday November 28 at 7pm.

Please keep in mind that **Crane Day is on the 12th of November.** Thanks again for all of your help and support this year.



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


## **Vernon Yacht Club Minutes** Summary




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month I was trying to Last make of sense the "Collision Regulations" that govern our conduct on the water. Since then there have been two serious boat collisions on our local lakes, and I start to wonder about the relevance of rules, designed for International commercial shipping, to our conduct on the local lakes in recreation vessels. Boating has changed as a recreational pastime over the years, it used to be more of a lifetime hobby for people who had a genuine interest in water born activity and they tended to make a commitment to doing it properly. Canadian Power and Sail Squadrons grew up as a result of these boaters. They developed education programs and organized boating activities. However, "The times they are a-changing" and as new technology has developed, newer lighter stronger

materials and lightweight high output engines, boating has changed. The Government, in an attempt to control the situation introduced the PCOC (Pleasure Craft Operators Card) in an attempt to control the situation, and it has largely failed after 10 years of application.

The PCOC is largely irrelevant to recreational boaters, they see little relevance in applying commercial shipping rules to their type of boating. I have taught PCOC classes for the Power Squadron to groups of fishermen who take small boats up to mountain lakes and with low powered motors they travel around slowly. Their main concern is not to foul the fishing gear, but as they are law abiding citizens they learned the shipping rules and got the card, mainly in case they got stopped in a road check by the Conservation Officer.

People who buy high speed boats for recreational purposes are generally not "boaters" in the old fashioned sense of the word. They buy a high speed craft and head for the wide open spaces of the lakes for either the thrill of speed or to tow someone around either on skis or inflatable

tubes, etc. The "Collision Regulations" are not very relevant to their activity. Maybe they should be taught only two rules. "WATCH OUT! and DON'T RUN INTO OTHER BOATS!

This may sound like a cynical approach to the current situation, but the PCOC program is not having the desired effect. It will take more time and effort on the part of government if they really want to make boating safer on the non-tidal waterways of the country. I have spoken to some people from other countries who have told me that boat ownership and operation is much more rigorous where they came from. The waterways of Europe are much more crowded and much more regulated. I don't know if they are any safer.

In order to drive on the highways we require that people take training, both theoretical and practical, and pass a driving test. Maybe in order to operate a boat on our lakes and rivers a similar program should be instituted. It will not stop stupidity but it may give people a better insight into the proper and safe way to go boating.

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


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#### Winter Security, Remembrance and the Grey Cup

# Where have our Ospreys gone?

Most likely our Ospreys have headed off on their winter migration down to Mexico or central America. Here is some information published by John Elliot of Environment Canada based on studies of radio tagged Ospreys. As you can see in the following figure and table, British Columbia Ospreys head south in early September to their southern wintering sites. If they survive the journey and winter the birds should return next May just when we have got our boats cleaned up.


