REAR COMMODORE'S REPORT

A very personal thank you to our retiring Executive Members: Ron Heuman; Larry Gilchuk; and Gerald Gustafson and for all of their hard

work and time devoted, for without their efforts and those who have served before we wouldn't have the facilities we enjoy today. And a very warm welcome to our new Executive Members: Dan Leboe; John Heard; and Ron McLean and thanks to them for sacrificing some of their valuable personal time to make a difference. Replacement of the first 8 wooden fingers on either side of C Dock at the deep end with concrete is now scheduled to take place in mid December. It is planned to proceed with this upgrade of C dock by replacing 4 wooden fingers each year with concrete, attaching them to the existing wooden mains until replacement of the mains can be budgeted for down the road.



Plans for replacement of the breakwater system are also underway with a request for engineered proposals being prepared. The design and fixed contract price for the breakwater system are needed ahead of being able to move forward on the regulatory approvals required to proceed and to arrange the necessary financing.

The initial steps to expand the floor area of the kitchen with an addition onto the southwest corner of the building are well underway. The necessary Code Review has been completed by MQN Architects and



now negotiations with the City of Vernon begin while the layout of the space and construction drawings are prepared to allow us to obtain competitive fixed price bids.

Removal of the Osprey pole was completed, under permit, with the assistance of the Armstrong Crane on Crane Day November 8th and Member Doug Fleming's lumberjack skills. The decision to proceed with the removal of the pole was driven by the desire to be a good neighbour as our neighbours to the west have been unable to enjoy their back yard as they should due to the bird's nasty behavior of projectile pooping to quite a radius from the nest. If anyone has an idea as to where the pole can be relocated please contact me.

Here's wishing for a short, mild winter and all the best to you and yours over the Christmas holiday season.

Snow Lanterns

- \Rightarrow Snow
- \Rightarrow Nonstick or tinned-steel Bundt pans, in various shapes and sizes
- \Rightarrow Pillar Candles
- \Rightarrow Spraybottle and water
- \Rightarrow Long fireplace matches

Pack snow into pans. To release, tap bottom of pan firmly. If the snow doesn't come out in 1 piece, repeat, letting the filled pan sit outside for 30 minutes to harden; then release.

Trim the wick of a candle to 1/4 inch, so the flame says small. Secure candle on a flat surface, such as a step, by packing snow around

it. Stack 3 snow forms over candle. Lightly spritz pillar with water; everything will freeze in place.

Cedar Chandelier

- \Rightarrow 16 inch diameter cedar wreath
- \Rightarrow 22 inch diameter cedar wreath
 - 17 yards of 2 inch wide red satin ribbon
- \Rightarrow Scissors
- \Rightarrow Ceiling hook

With the small wreath's wire frame facing up, slip 1 end of a 5 foot ribbon length through frames' rim, and knot firmly. Repeat with 2 additional 5 foot ribbons, knotting at evenly spaced intervals around the wreath.

Gather ribbons together, and knot at a point 15 inches above the center of wreath. Leave these hanger ribbons in center of wreath

while working on large wreath. Attach three 4 foot ribbon lengths to large wreath frame.

Place large wreath on top of small wreath, alighing hanger ribbons. Gather hanger ribbons of both wreaths together, and knot 20 inches above center of large wreath. Trim ends of hanger ribbons above top knot to create a finished look.

Screw hook into heiling. Hang wreaths from top hanger-ribbon knot.

Tie a 4 foot ribbon length at base of each hanger ribbon, and fashion into classic bow. Trim bow tails to 12 inches.

Christmas Treat Ideas

Grinch Punch

- \Rightarrow 1/3 cup sugar
- \Rightarrow 6 tablespoons + 1-1/2 teaspoons water
- \Rightarrow 1/3 cup evaporated milk
- \Rightarrow 1/2 tsp pure almond extract
- $\Rightarrow~$ 12 drops neon green food coloring
- \Rightarrow 2 liters lemon-lime soda, chilled
- \Rightarrow 2 pints vanilla ice cream

Directions:

In a large saucepan, combine sugar and water. Cook and stir over medium heat until sugar is dissolved; remove from heat. Stir in

milk and extract. Transfer to a bowl; cool at room temperature. Cover and refrigerate until chilled. Just before servicing, transfer milk mixture to a punch bowl. Stir in the food coloring and soda. Top with scoops of ice cream. Yield: 4 quarts.



Ginger Snaps

- 1 cup butter or margarine
- 1 1/2 cups white sugar
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 tbsp baking soda
- 1 cup molasses
- 4 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 cup white sugar for decoration

- 2 tsp baking powder 1tbsp ground ginger
- 1 1/2 tsp each cinnamon, nutmeg, cloves, Allspice

Preheat over to 350 degrees. Grease cookie sheet

In a large bow, cream together the butter and 1 1/2 cups of sugar until smooth. Mix in the eggs, and then the molasses. Combine the whole wheat flour, baking soda, baking powder, ginger, nutmeg, cinnamon, cloves, and all-spice, heaping the measures if you like a lot of spice. Stir the dry ingredients into the molasses mixture just until blended.

Roll the dough into small balls, and dip the top of each ball into the remaining white sugar. Place the cookies about 2 inches apart on the cookie sheets.

Bake for 10 to 15 minutes in the preheated oven, until the tops are cracked. Bake longer for crispy cookies, less time for chewy cookies. Cool on wire racks.
