All vessels and trailers stored on club property, **MUST be registered, and tagged prior to storage.**

Fill out required form as complete as possible and submit to the office or put in the slot in the office door.

Copies are also available in the clubhouse on the wall beside the lower door or by the ramp going upstairs.

Parking spot assignment – MUST Contact Ken Smith 250-308-9177 or Norm Bryan 250-308-9931 or Fleet Captain Al Cuttriss 250-309-6004.

All boats with trailers must be parked on the East side of the property. Please park within 2 feet of your neighbours.

Only boats without trailers are allowed parking on the gravel section.

Locking your trailer? A key must be left at the office.

Any boats requiring cradles or blocks must be parked on the West side of the property (gravel area) but keep northwest areas clear for Crane Day on Nov 7.

Saturday morning began with "Jesse" heading out to Cameron Point to set up the start line . Cameron point was picked because often The bay in front of our yacht club has very light air , however on this occasion that was not the case . The start time was set at 8.30 pm , the racing instruction was for those boats who had radios to monitor channel 28, but we found that for some reason no-one could communicate on 28. I suggested changing to channel 6 but some skippers were uncomfortable going against the sailing instructions . Having to hail to the boats, I made the decision that prior to the start we would monitor channel 6 , then after the start switching to 28 .

Several boats were late getting to the starting area, so I postponed the race for 30 minutes ,, By 9 am all the boats were in place, I had set up for a one start with a start line of about 150 meters . The start was clean , with a fairly strong south wind and all boats making good time .

I really enjoyed the experience , and all the visitors seemed to have enjoyed their time in Vernon and the wind helped make the whole race a fun time , its always a good time when we have the southern yacht clubs send members up to us and we so enjoy having them .

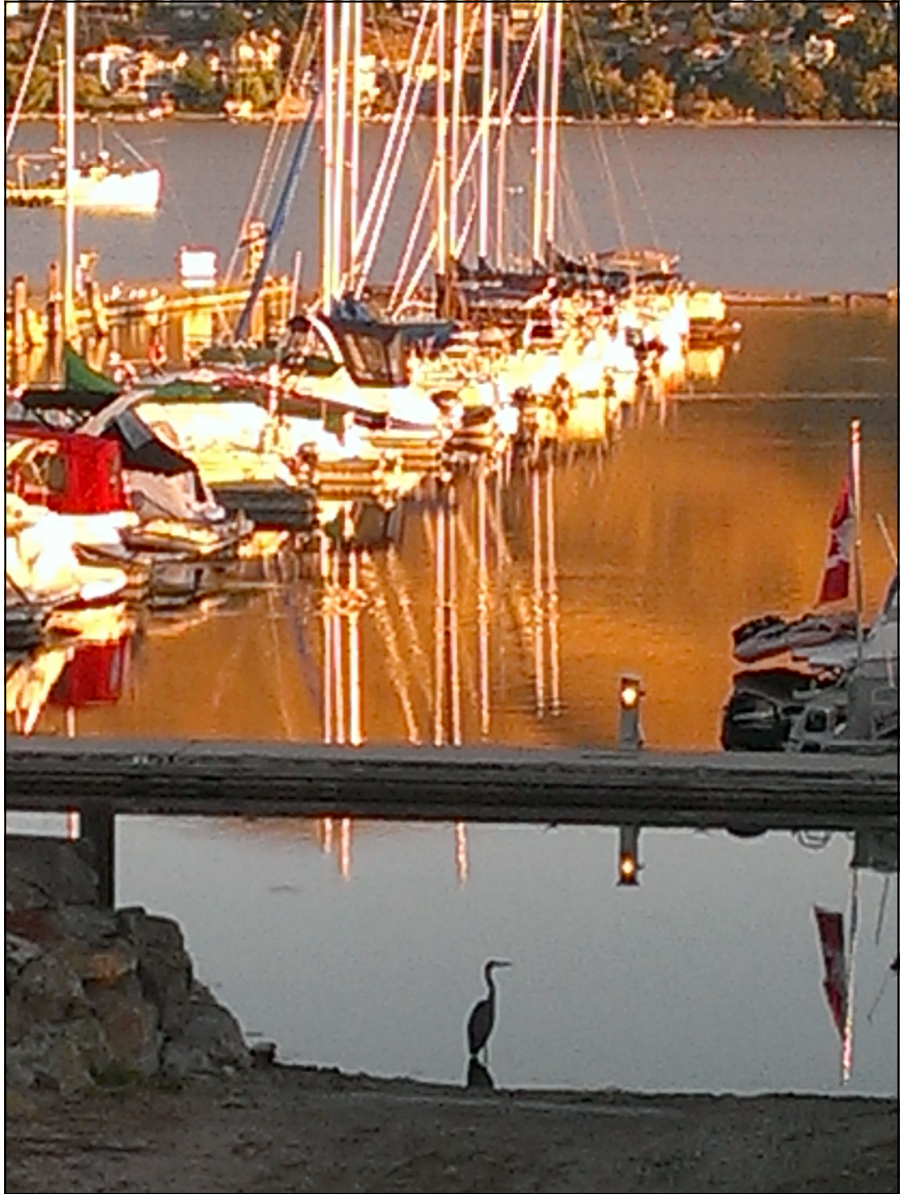

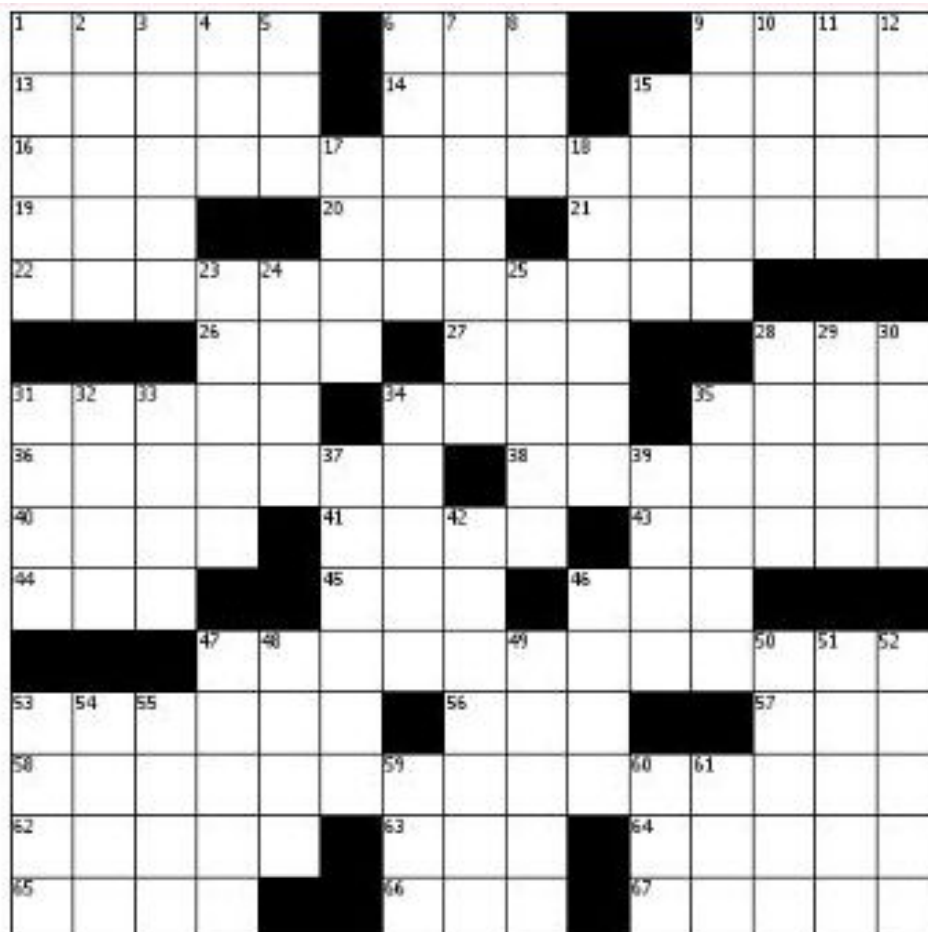
