Thank you to all Vernon Yacht Club Security Team members for their long hours. Keep up the good work!



News From the Rear Commodore–Craig Williams

Rear Commodores Report – June 7, 2016

- May 25, 2016 received confirmation from the Ministry of Forests, Lands and Natural Resource Operations we could proceed with our test piles under our Section 9 Notification
- June 1st and 2nd Burton Marine drove 4 test piles, which had to be placed close to the existing floating b/w considering we have yet to receive confirmation we can proceed with our replacement b/w and the hazard they would represent if left in the open for any period of time as originally anticipated
- Test piles were successful and the engineer was pleased with the results though they had to be driven 30 feet deeper into the lake bed than what was anticipated (90 feet in the deepest water)
- The ministry has responded to our Section 9 Notification for our b/w replacement plan saying it would be subject to a full review due to concerns expressed by neighbours about the proposed relocation of the western breakwater and the Ministry's view the addition of any more than 3 slips triggers a full review. This is contradictory to verbal advice our environmental consultant received from the Ministry a number of months ago when we began this process
- A full review is a process that could take many months, if not more, so we are requesting a meeting
 with the Ministry for as soon as possible to present our case that the application should be treated as
 a Notification as indicated in verbal conversation last year
- The Ministry also indicated the b/w could be replaced in its current location with some minor changes so Burton Marine has been asked to draft an alternate plan and costing to erect a solid wall b/w running perpendicular to shore along the line of our existing floating b/w and extending all our existing docks further out to gain the additional slips rather than adding AA dock and fingers to the west side of A dock as originally proposed if we are unsuccessful with the Ministry pleading our case to them
- Received from Regular Member Lorne Holowachuk recommendations for modifications to the replacement b/w design presented at the Extraordinary GM, which are being addressed for a response
- Update on security access system: additional fobs cost \$8.00 each, down from the previous \$10.00 we were paying now that we control the coding of them
- In-line electrical meters for dock receptacles are \$530.00 each plus installation, will come up with a
 recommendation to add more commencing next year for docks E, D and A (in that order) where the
 larger boats are, leaving B and C docks till a later date
- 2016 Fire Inspection completed April 28th by the Vernon Fire Dept. noted a deficiency in the kitchen due to the lack of a proper hood with fire suppression and exhaust and make-up air fans and that we are not permitted to cook on our flat-top grill or burners anything that creates grease laden vapours
- Recommend pursuing a proper hood for the kitchen with fire suppression and exhaust and make-up air fans at a budgeted cost of \$10,000 to comply with fire inspection, this should also reduce heat build-up and odors in the kitchen that permeate into the lounge area
- Parking in the lot continues to be an issue with greater use of the facilities, especially on weekends, with boat trailers being left on the paved surface and vehicles left attached to trailers on the gravel portion making for inefficient use of the respective areas. Recommend posting rules on both floors of Club House; mailing our parking rules through Canada Post to ALL members; and institute the ability to tow offending vehicles/trailers after first warning left on windshield
- The shrimp fishing vessels and related crafts tying to our east log bundle b/w without permission continue to be of concern to the b/w's integrity and the removal of these vessels is being actively pursued
- Email request of May 10, 2016 from Social Member and RCMSR Member Ciy Young for letter of support from the VYC to accompany their submissions for grant funding to various agencies



STANDARDS FOR SECURING BOATS AT VERNON YACHT CLUB MARINA



The mooring standards as presented below are designed to prevent damage to your boat, the docks and other boats. You are required to use appropriately sized mooring lines with snubbers or spring steel on lines of less than 10 feet in length. A properly secured boat will be held by **a minimum of three lines**. Attach lines correctly to cleats and keep snug so lines do not droop into the water. Use fenders to prevent contact of your boat with the dock or other boats.

Terminology:

Bow – the forward part of a boat.
Bow Line – a docking line leading from the bow.
Chafing Gear – tubing or leather wrapping used to protect a line from chafing on a rough surface.
Cleat – the metal fixture on the dock (or on your boat) used to attach lines to securely moor your boat.
Fender – a cushion, placed between boats, or between a boat and a dock, to prevent damage.
Line – nautical term for ropes used in sailing and securing your boat to a dock.

Pile – a wood, metal or concrete pole driven into the

Shubber – a hubber of spring steel device attached to a mooring line to reduce shock to the boat and the dock.
Spring Line – a line used to prevent the boat from moving forward or backward while made fast to a dock.
Stern – the after or back part of a boat.
Stern Line – a docking line leading from the stern.

Lines can generally be categorized as follows:

Laid Nylon – a twisted line of nylon fibers may be used as a mooring line.


Single Braided or Double Braided Nylon (braided core covered with braided jacket) – are the best lines for moorage as they have good abrasion resistance and resistance to rot.

Polypropylene (the common yellow or white ski rope) – must NOT be used as a mooring line.

Size of line recommended for size of boat:

Boats to 20 feet = 3/8 inch diameter line Boats 20 to 35 feet = 1/2 inch diameter line Boats 35 to 45 feet = 5/8 inch diameter line







East wins the ?A and returns a Diamond which must be won in Dummy. Now Declarer has no way back to his hand to draw that last enemy trump. He'll cash a Diamond and lead another one, but, when East follows to the third round, Declarer will know that his goose is cooked. Whether he ruffs high or low, West's ?J will score a trick. Down one!

Of course, the winning line is to ruff the opening Heart lead, cross to the ?A, *ruff another Heart*, and *then* draw trumps. Now is the time for that yippee. Trick 1 was the time for thinking.


