I'd thought that I would share a quick update as to what has been happening as well as what our next month or two looks like around the club facilities. During our cold snap in January a fitting in our aging radiant heating system froze and burst. Fortunately, it was discovered and repaired quickly with very little damage to the building. We are currently looking at upgrades to the system. A huge thanks to members that have helped and are still helping out to keep the snow clear around the dock, deck and building exits.

The new breakwater project has been moving along and is already protecting the docks and boats very effectively from wind and wave action. Hopefully we can add some new slips early this season with our larger footprint. Much thanks to Craig W for his dedication and diligence on this one! We will be reaching out for help to replace the remaining deteriorating rub rails, primarily on E and W docks. Liam F will likely send out a request to the affected slip users to remove their dock edge protection prior to the repairs to make a smoother transition. We will be wrapping up this spring's replacement project ahead of crane day.

Deck/dock and lot cleanup will be done in April between crane day and the upcoming VYC Boat Show. Again, we'll be looking for an army of volunteers to clear the dust, as well as droppings from our feathered friends and complete our annual spring cleaning.

If you are looking to augment your boating skills CPS offers a variety of courses that you can take such as Maritime Radio Certificate, Boat and Engine Maintenance, Practical Weather for Boaters, and Electronic Navigation, many of these courses are offered online and some may be run in person at our club, for more information see the CPS website, click on the link below:

In preparation for crane day the boats in Winter Moorage Slips need to be returned to their assigned slips by April 1st, the boats in the parking lot should be moved by the following dates: Boats stored in the parking lot in **Row 3** should be removed by **April 1st.** 

Boats stored in Row 2 should be removed by April 8th.

Boats stored in **Row 1** should be removed by **April 15th.** 

Boats stored on the lawn or graveled areas should also be removed by April 15th.

We will be assigning slips to members on the waitlist around March 15th, we currently have 85 people on the list and while we will not be able to accommodate everyone we will do our best to get as many boats in the water as we can.

Hope to see you all around the club this summer.


Our women's sailing/racing 2024 season will run on Tuesday evenings from May 7 to June 25.


Last year we had 7 boats (all with coaches) out for our Tuesday evening events. We had a lot of fun and improved our skills too.


