BILL WEST - 2024 VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR, VYC


It is with great pride that we recognize Bill West as the 2024 Volunteer of the Year at the VYC.

First of all, thanks to all of you for your support, volunteering for the many projects directly and behind the scenes. I won't bore you with too many details.

We managed to squeak another year out of our aging heating, cooling and hot water system without any major issues. During the cold snap last January we experienced a failure in our radiant heat line downstairs under the floor by the shuffleboard table. Fortunately it wasn't upstairs, as the water damage would likely have been quite extensive. Our plan is to adjust this year's budget dollars to upgrade the system so that it will operate safely and efficiently in ALL seasons.

The 2024 rub rail replacement went well this year as it was completed in April with Darcy M keeping ahead of and coordinating an army of volunteers to see it through.

Other interesting challenges include some hungry muskrats chewing through our water supply lines on the docks in a few instances.

Thanks to Rob S, Scott C, Wally H and Duane B to inspect and repair the several VYC club buoys and associated anchoring components out on the water at this end of the lake. There are provincial licensing regulations and documentation that have to be performed annually to meet our obligations.

I have enjoyed meeting and working with you all during my second year on the board and am looking forward to an even better year going forward.

AGM REPORT FROM OUR FLEET CAPTAIN

For the 2024 boating season our marina was fully assigned. We were able to assign 21 permanent slips and were able to get 28 other members into sublets of various durations. As of October 1, 2024 our waitlist is at 68.

I would like to thank the Moorage Committee members Roger Price and Scott Chapman for their assistance throughout the year. The help provided is much appreciated.

I continue to get a good response from the membership to my endless requests for reciprocal slips. The member cooperation makes that part of my job much easier and also bolsters our well deserved reputation as the friendliest club on the lake. Thanks to everyone for that.

Winter storage has been allocated. As of this date we have been able to accommodate everyone who requested it.

We are still hoping to add the additional fingers to "A" dock this year. That would give us potentially twelve large slips, four 32' slips and eight 40' slips. Timeline for this has yet to be determined. The engineers have recommended that 32' is the minimum size for boats on the outside of "A".

We had a number of security issues throughout the year. We do plan on augmenting the camera coverage on the docks in the coming year. We also had a number of members reporting that their boats had been damaged in the marina. Not everyone knows everyone in the club so telling your neighbour you bumped their boat is not always easy. With that in mind I have created (borrowed/stolen) an "Incident Form" that we will place outside the office so members can inform the office if they inadvertently make contact with another boat and we can communicate the information effectively. Hopefully that will reduce the number of emails I ask Marjon to send out.

AGM REPORT FROM OUR MEMBERSHIP DIRECTOR

This AGM represents the halfway point of my term as Membership Director. Our boating season is now coming to a close for 2024, but we can look back on this year and call it a good one. We've had a decent, warm, smoke free, blue skies Okanagan summer at the VYC, and we've enjoyed a list of activities that ran from spring to fall.

This club is so much more and does so much more than the usual 'moorage and storage'. It's comprised of some of the best people in Vernon, and has a camaraderie, and sense of community within its membership. As clubs go, the VYC sets the bar really high.

Fun filled events this past Summer included the Vernon Boat Show, Sail Past and Commodore's Ball, the VYC Regatta, the Invasion, the Rib-Off, two Pig Roasts, Tuesday Ladies Racing, Wednesday and Sunday Racing, the Solstice Race, the Canada Day Paddlewheel Race, a Poker Run, Mexican Night, a Whisky Tasting, the Okanagan Lake End to End Race, and Ladies Nights.

Coming up in the offseason, we have Tuesday Games Nights, Karaoke with DJ Stevie B, Santa's Brunch, Superbowl, Grey Cup, Stanley Cup, and the New Years Celebration to look forward to.

We have a waitlist for moorage. The number of members waiting for slips is in the 60's. I see this list as an indicator of two situations. The first is, we're not big enough to support the number of slips demanded by the growing community, and we need to expand to recognize that demand. That is being addressed. The second is, we're in demand partly due to the popularity of our club, its functions, and events. Being in demand is good for the health of the club going forward.

Club Limitations: The maximum number of Regular members is based on 150% of the number of slips at the club. We have 271 slips which allows for a maximum of 406 Regular members.

The maximum number of Social members is 33% of the current Regular and Affiliate total.

Maximum club membership capacity is 540. Currently we have 371 Regular/Affiliate members. This allows for 124 Social members, and a club total of 495. As of September 28th, 2024 our membership numbers are as follows: Regular 336. Affiliate 35. Social 106. Honorary 1. Life 7. Total 485.

Membership Attrition: Vernon Yacht Club has roughly 5% membership attrition annually.

It's been a pleasure working with this board as your Membership Director over the past year. Thank-you all for your input and support.



CRANE DAZE - OCTOBER 2024

We actually had two Crane days at VYC this fall! Through circumstances beyond our control the best laid plan for a Friday crane fizzled just days earlier. Alpha Crane, a company that we've had more experience with came to our aid and set up for Wednesday October 23, an unusual day of the week for the job.

Despite the shake up on dates, operations went relatively smoothly. The new, later date left a small flock of snowbirds out of the loop. This made for logistical challenges for the homesteaders. With fewer trucks and drivers to move trailers into position to catch boats the remaining hands-on-deck did a magnificent job loading trailers and moving boats around the lots successfully preventing grid lock.



Crane Day - the only day a 13,000 lb boat can fly through the air

Chief Strategist Mike L ran the crane-out with military precision and had each boat lead wearing a fluorescent vest, so the crane crew knew who to listen to. Tactician assistants kept track of boat order with stopwatches tracking performance. Eggers and coffee from the kitchen kept sailors and crane operators energized and ready for the day. It is always a sight to behold and members came out to spectate and lend a hand where they could.

Every year someone comes up with an improvement and this year Carol C suggested tying a line under your boat which is fastened side to side before crane lift, so when they go to fish the

stern sling under the boat you can just tie one side to your line and pull it under the boat and up the other side. This is a time saver and saves slinging into position past the rudder, motor, and prop shaft.

Another trick by Liam F was to place strips of moving blankets between the hull and potentially gritty slings to save your paint job.

The weather cooperated with cool but not freezing tem-


Other standout events included 9 Ladies Nights, the Vernon Regatta, and the Boat Show. Be on watch for more event posters coming your way.














TILLER RECIPES

German Plum Streusel

Submitted by Bob A

Serves 12

Prep Time: 20 minutes
Cook Time: 50 minutes

Total Time: 1 hour, 10 minutes

Cooking Directions:

- 1 Preheat your oven to 350°F (180°C). Lightly butter a 9-inch pan. In a bowl combine flour and baking powder. Add sugar, vanilla extract, lemon zest, butter, and eggs to the bowl and beat on low speed until combined then increase speed to medium-high and beat until smooth, about 2 minutes.
- Spread the batter evenly into the cake pan. Place the plums on top of the batter.
- 3 Make the streusel: In a bowl combine flour, sugar, and cinnamon. Add soft butter and beat until everything is combined and crumbs have a coarse and crumbly texture about 1 minute.
- 4 Using your hands sprinkle the streusel evenly on top of the plums.
- Bake for about 50 minutes or until the top of the cake is lightly golden.

 Let the cake sit in the pan for about 10 minutes, then run a knife around the edge of the pan. Let cool to room temp and serve. Enjoy!

Ingredients:

1.5 lbs plums, pitted and quartered

FOR THE CAKE BATTER:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ¾ cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, or vanilla sugar
- ½ teaspoon lemon zest, freshly grated (optional)
- ½ cup unsalted butter, room temp
- 2 large eggs, room temperature

FOR THE STREUSEL:

- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- ½ cup sugar
- ¼ teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ cup unsalted butter, room temp
