
2025 VERNON REGATTA

The Santana 525 Nationals at the Vernon Regatta

The Santana 525 National Regatta remains a highlight for sailing enthusiasts, especially in British Columbia's Okanagan region. Designed by W. Shad Turner and built by W.D. Schock Corp between 1977 and 1982, the Santana 525 is a 25-foot fiberglass monohull known for its agility and responsiveness. With a fractional sloop rig, fin keel, and internally mounted spade-type rudder, the boat is well-suited to the dynamic and sometimes challenging conditions of Okanagan Lake.

In 2023, the Kelowna Yacht Club hosted the Santana 525 Nationals from July 21–23, drawing a strong and competitive fleet. Kelowna's commitment to the class has helped keep the Santana 525's legacy alive and thriving. This year, the Vernon Yacht Club (VYC) proudly takes on the challenge of hosting the event.

NEWS FROM OUR MEMBERSHIP DIRECTOR




Membership Director Simon J. offered a candid update on the current state of club membership at the latest executive meeting, sharing both insight and optimism for the future.

"It's been a bit quiet on the new membership front over the last few months," Simon noted, reflecting on the recent lull in sign-ups. "It's surprising because it's a great time to sign up, with the low number of members on the boat slip waitlist," he added, pointing out a rare opportunity for prospective members.

While the dip in new enrollments may be puzzling, Simon acknowledged that "there are some economic factors that may be playing a role." Despite this, membership numbers remain strong and vibrant. Simon says that the club currently boasts 318 Regular Members and 35 Affiliates. Additionally, with 97 Social Members, only a few coveted social spots remain available.

When Honorary and Life Members are included, the total membership count reaches a robust 458. And as Simon put it, "That is plenty to fill the dance floor at our parties."





FAILURE TO LAUNCH

You are 18 now, it's time for you to go...



I remember when you first arrived, new, unwrinkled, and full of promise. I have watched you get older and frankly a little flabby around the edges. You never really did

much in those 18 years, just hung around often spending entire winters in the basement. So now I must see you off and make room for one who might be a little more reliable.

Transport Canada does not specify when an inflatable PFD should be replaced but I thought I would just check the label on mine to see how old it was;

18 years! How did that happen? Quite a few of the boating sites on the web seem to suggest that an inflatable PFD be replaced every 8 to 10 years. Mine showed a manufacturing date of 2007 which is out-



side that window by quite a bit. It's probably fine, seemed to work well enough when I accidentally set it off last year much to the amusement of my fellow boaters, but still 18 years does make one think about replacing it for safety's sake.

Transport Canada provides some general rules for inspecting and servicing lifejackets:

- Before you put on your lifejacket, check the following:
- Damage or signs of wear: Are there any tears, burns or puncture marks, or is there any mold?
- Status indicator: Is it green?
- Inflation pull-tab: Is it easy to reach?
- CO2 cylinder: Check that it is installed correctly and does not show signs of corrosion (like rust).

Transport Canada also states:

If you do not know when your lifejacket was last serviced, you should check it now.

That is very wise advice indeed.

Remember you need to have I approved PFD for every person onboard your boat and for an inflatable PFD to be considered approved it must be worn if the person is in the cockpit or on deck.

In Belgium it's "Crane Day" every day



Engineering Wonders in Belgium: Boat Lifts

We, here at the *Vernon Yacht Club*, lift our boats up high into the water of Okanagan Lake once a year, only to be taken out again at the end of the season. But did you know that there are boat lifts in Belgium that do this every day? Belgium is famous for its medieval towns and Renaissance architecture; but it is less known for is its remarkable achievements in industrial engineering.

Located on the *Canal du Centre*, the Strépy-Thieu funicular lift is the second largest boat lift in the world and its 73.15 metres incline is quite impressive

This boat lift pictured on the right is newer and was constructed between 1982 and 2002. But this impressive lifting is nothing new, they have been doing this for 140 years. Four of the older lifts are still fully operational in their original condition. The boat lifts in the province of Hainaut are a crucial necessity





considering the significant elevation changes of the canal, linking two major rivers throughout Europe. The four old boat lifts were constructed between **1885 and 1919** to address a significant 66.2-meter difference in elevation throughout just 7 km. Four hydraulic lifts, each using water displacement to operate, allow for the continuous transportation of boats up to 300 tonnes, and are unique for being the only ones of their kind still functioning in their original form (swing bridges, lifts etc.).

Pictured to the left is the oldest lift built in 1885.

The new lift has a height difference of 73.15 m between the upstream and downstream sections. It is the tallest in Europe. It can accommodate boats up to 1,350 tonnes. The lift itself takes only 6 minutes to fully displace all that water and it uses weights of 7200–8400 tonnes, 112 suspension cables and 32 control cables. It spans 498 metres (1,634 ft). The watertight gates are designed to withstand a 5 km/h impact from these heavy vessels. Impressive numbers, aren't they?

The Strépy-Thieu boat lift is an impressive structure. Inside the lift a museum can be visited. While the museum focuses on the modern lift's construction, it also explains the history of the *Canal du Centre* and its importance as a shipping channel. The Strépy-Thieu boat lift stands proud and tall on the Belgian skyline and makes its presence known to everyone visiting.

VYC CLUB SAIL RACING








THAILAND TRIP!

Al sent *Tiller Topics* a trip story this winter that just missed the deadline for the last issue. Here are some great photos. It sounds like a place worth checking out if you are planning a 2025/26 winter trip.

"We arrived in Bangkok on Dec 30 and stayed 2 nights to get adjusted to the time difference (Bangkok is 15 hours ahead). From there we took a train south to the Khao Sam Roi Yot district for 3 nights followed up by 1 night at Pharadonphap Beach to catch the ferry the following morning to the island of Kho Tao, a smaller island with beautiful beaches. After 4 days at Kho Tao, we took the ferry south to the island of Kho Pha Ngan, a larger island with more beautiful beaches. 
