It's fascinating to think that as we sail past the commodore in 2025, we are partaking in a ritual that dates back **600 years**. Originally, Admirals would review entire navies on special occasions to assess readiness and capability, and to show respect to the Commander-in-Charge. Over the last 200 years, this naval tradition has evolved, with thousands of yacht clubs around the world performing a "review of the fleet."



The Sail Past marks the official start of the boating season. Tradition dictates that all Club members participate in the Sail Past, on their own or on another member's yacht. Etiquette requires that a member unable to participate will send their regrets to the Commodore.

Mark **Sunday June 22nd** on your calendar. Let's empty the yacht club basin of boats, break out our Canadian flags and begin to form a single line of boats, following our past commodores and visiting commodores from the clubs of Okanagan Lake, as we sail past the commodore. Consider this invitation an opportunity to prove the seaworthiness of your vessel.

How to Take Part in the 2025 Sail Past

The Sail Past is on Sunday, June 22nd!

Let's empty the basin of our boats, do the sail past, and enjoy a fun day on the water!

STARTING TIME: Approximately 11:30 am

PLEASE MONITOR VHF CHANNEL 72

DRESSING YOUR BOAT:

- **SAILING FLEET:** Secure your VYC Burgee above the sail squadron flag (if you have one) on the outer starboard shroud. The Canadian flag flies from the stern.
- **POWER FLEET:** The VYC Burgee is mounted on the bow flagstaff. The Canadian flag flies from the stern.

VESSELS SHOULD PROCEED IN THE FOLLOWING ORDER:

- 1. Past Vernon Yacht Club Commodores
- 2. Visiting Commodores/ Dignitaries
- 3. Current Executive
- 4. Sailing Fleet (under power) Lead by Bob Annand
- 5. Power Fleet
- 6. Visitors



The Commodore's boat will be moored at the white sailing fleet start line marker buoy, north of the breakwater.

Each group should form up south west of the Commodore's boat and the log breakwater; circling in a counter clockwise direction, approximately 2 boat lengths between each vessel. Boats should pass the Commodore's boat on the starboard side at a distance of approximately 30 meters at a speed of 5 knots or less.

Each boat's Canadian flag should be dipped or gathered for approximately 5 seconds during the salute as you pass the Commodore's boat. (a crew member may gather the flag against the flagstaff, releasing it after passing the Commodore) At the same time, Captains (wearing hats please) will salute the Commodore for 5 seconds while passing the Commodore's boat. Crew should stand or sit upright and facing the Commodore's boat.

2025 OKANAGAN LAKE SWIM

World Record Title Attempt by Robyn Coleman

"Thank you to the *Vernon Yacht Club* for your support in the start of our journey", says Robyn Coleman, a 19-year-old open water swimmer from Alberta.

"I will be attempting to set a brand-new Guinness World Record official title: Fastest time to swim the length of Okanagan Lake (female) to raise funds and awareness for the Heart & Stroke Foundation. A cause close to me as a paediatric stroke survivor."

The event consists of a continuous wetsuit swim spanning 106km/65.9 miles, from the left arm of Lake Okanagan by the city of Vernon, to the complete other side of the lake, finishing in the city of Penticton.

"My goal is to complete the swim in under 50 hours (or just under 2 days)."

The only related current record is set at 40 hours 57 minutes and 11 seconds by a male named Adam Ellenstein who completed the feat in 2016.




SPRING FLING FUN

THE BIG WHEEL AT VYC

It's easy to walk into the Vernon Yacht Club and not give a second glance to some of the décor around us. But when you pause and take a closer look, you'll find a treasure trove of history in the trophies, plaques, and artifacts throughout the building.



One striking piece that catches the eye is the large ship's wheel mounted on the feature wall in the Gangplank. This is no mere decoration—it's a genuine artifact and a piece of British Columbia's maritime history, dating back to the era when paddle wheelers traveled the inland waters of our province. The plaque beneath the wheel offers a glimpse into this history, as well as a tribute to one

of the club's earliest commodores, John Dedora. If you take a closer look, you'll find the story of how the wheel came to be part of the Yacht Club's heritage.



"This Ship's Wheel is presented to the Vernon Yacht Club by JOHN AND EILEEN DEDORA on the occasion of the Club's 50th Anniversary, June 14. 2003. Thought to be a relic of the Arrow Lakes paddle wheelers and obtained by John In 1954, it became part of the nautical theme of Johnny's Grill, Vernon. John first donated it to the VYC in 1959. During 1967 he took it home for repairs. The Club burnt to the ground a few days later on Feb. 14. 1967 and the wheel rested in the Dedora's basement until 2003. John Is a founding member of VYC and was Commodore in 1955."


